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Brown County Schools - Summer School 2017 Student Enrollment Form



Eligibility - Any student that has failed a course, needs to retake a course, has approval to take a course for the first time to open up room in their schedule or desires to take a course not offered during the school year may sign up for online summer classes.

Available Courses* – Summer school courses are offered in 2 summer sessions and in 2 instructional formats. Traditional courses, which are taught in the classroom during the first summer session only, are: Algebra I, Composition/English 10, Integrated Chemistry/Physics (ICP), and Basic PE. Please note that any **class of 2018** student taking **English 10 will sit for the corresponding ECA on June 28th**. All other courses will be delivered via an online format, using the PLATO Courseware program.

Traditional Courses: Students may take 1 course during Session 1 ONLY.

Online Courses: Students may take 1 course during Session 1 and 1 course during Session 2.

How does Plato work? – Plato is an online learning program. All that is needed is an internet connection and the student can work at any time of the day, for as much time as needed. At the beginning of each course unit students will be given a pretest. The score on the pretest will not factor into the final grade, but gives the student an opportunity to test out of material they may already know. After the pretest, students will have approximately 20 tutorials that provide instruction on the material. There is a corresponding mastery test (5-10 question quiz) that goes along with each tutorial. Some tutorials also have a corresponding written assignment. Upon completion of all mastery tests in the unit students will then complete a posttest. Final grades will be 30% mastery test average, 30% unit posttest average and 40% final exam average. All grading is done by Brown County High School Staff. Students and staff may communicate though the Plato e-mail about any questions, comments or concerns. Students will sign up for summer school by May 26th (for either OR both sessions). Late enrollment is allowed pending administrative approval. Student orientation on May 25th will occur after both check outs in the auditorium. If students don't get registered in time for Session 1, Session 2 registration is available. Students would need to discuss this with a counselor during June 8th or June 15th lab hours.
