



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# **BCJHS POETS**

To kick off the year in Mrs. Stark's Language Arts classes, students explored aspects of their identity and wrote about themselves to express their personalities, strengths, areas for growth, and what makes them unique. Seventh grader Alayna Jacobus explains how students examined where they fell within three zones: the comfort zone, the risk zone, and the danger zone. "To be in the comfort zone means that you are in a particular situation that makes you feel at ease. Being in the risk zone means that you are in a particular situation that puts you out of your comfort zone, but you learn and grow from the experience. To be in the danger zone means that you are in a particular situation that makes you feel stressed to an unhealthy level. Sharing my life and hobbies with other people puts me in the comfort zone. Sharing something personal with someone that I don't trust completely puts me in the danger zone, as well as telling a teacher that I disagree with them. Dealing with a loss, doing remote learning, and confronting people puts me in the risk zone. The best place for a situation to fall is in the risk zone because you learn and grow from the experience." Within this unit, they also developed poetry, shared song lyrics that expressed their identity, wrote a structured essay, and created multiple artistic representations of aspects of their identity. Some of our students were brave enough to share what they've been working on. Check out some of their work!

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# **Indiana 21st Century Scholars Program**

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all of our parents about the great opportunity that is available through the Indiana 21st Century Scholars Program. The 21st Century Scholars Program began in 1990 to insure that every Hoosier student can afford the opportunity provided by a college degree. Income-Eligible students, who keep the *Scholar Pledge* to excellence in school and life, receive a scholarship to help pay for their college education. The scholarship provides up to four years of paid tuition at an eligible Indiana college or university.

7th and 8th grade students, whose families meet income eligibility guidelines, can apply to become a 21st Century Scholar. Applications must be received by **June 30th** of the student's 8th grade year. Eligibility requirements are outlined on the 21st Century Scholars webpage. If you determine that you are eligible for the 21st Century Scholars Program, you can apply online at **Scholars.IN.gov** or by submitting the 2020-2021 application worksheet to BCJHS authorizing school personnel to submit the application on your behalf. BCJHS will also make computers and wifi available to any parent who needs assistance in submitting the application.

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# All BCS Schools Earn Purple Star Designation

The Indiana Department of Education recently congratulated the recipients of Indiana's inaugural Purple Star school designation. The Purple Star designation honors schools displaying a significant commitment to service members, veterans, students, and families connected to our nation's military.

"As a proud military parent, I know firsthand the honor and respect our nation's military deserves," said State Superintendent Dr. Jennifer McCormick. "I want to thank Indiana schools for their commitment to honoring and highlighting military service members. I am happy to award the inaugural Purple Star designation to a group of very deserving schools."

In its first year, schools had to meet specific requirements to receive the Purple Star school designation. These include, assigning a point of contact for military families, passing a resolution supporting military students and families, guaranteeing interviews for service members and their immediate family who meet the minimum job qualifications, and more. In total, 60 schools received the inaugural designation.

We are grateful to BCHS Teachers Mrs. Adams and Mrs. Lewellen for leading the way with this incredible distinction. Additionally, it goes without saying that our local Veterans are truly extraordinary partners and supporters of the schools.
