By far, the number one concern of parents that I talk with in the counseling office is their student's cell phone use. Cell phone and internet use are also the most prevalent causes of problems that our young people bring to my door.

I remember several years ago when a popular talk show host did a humorous episode on cell phones. She took a camera to the streets of Chicago and noted how many people were talking on their phones. She pondered the somewhat funny question of, "Who are all these people talking to?" At the time it was relatively new for so many people to possess a cell phone and texting was nowhere near as popular as it is now. Yet, it was astounding the number of people who were using their phones. Today, it is next to impossible to be out in public and spot a single person not using a phone. It is becoming more and more difficult to find a person to make eye contact with because so many of us are looking down at our phones. Last week I stopped in Greenwood Mall and I was really surprised at all of the people leaning against the wall looking at their phones – didn't they come there to shop and spend time with others?

Some of you may be thinking, "Come on Boomer calm down!" and I will admit that my demographic cohort makes all of this a little harder to keep up with. However, I spend the better part of my life immersed in the lives of tweens and young teens and see first-hand the evolution of technology and its effects on our society. Admittedly, smart phones have increased our quick access to information; we can quickly receive emergency mobile alerts and easily stay in touch with our friends and family. These are just a few of the positive ways cell phones are affecting our lives. However, with 75% of children 10 and older possessing cell phones and 81% of Americans receiving five times as many texts as phone calls per day, I feel this is a subject worth exploring.
