



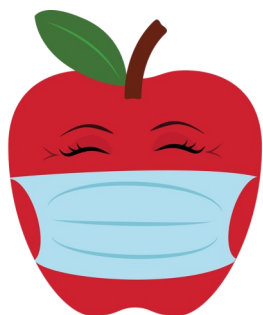

COVID-19 Health and Safety Protocols

MASKS/FACE COVERINGS

- Facial coverings are required for all students and staff regardless of COVID-19 vaccination status.
- All individuals are required to wear facial coverings on school buses regardless of vaccination status per Federal requirements.
- All students presenting to the Health Office with COVID-19 symptoms will be asked to wear a mask.



SCREENING/EXCLUSION/ REPORTING

- Students/staff should self-screen each day for COVID-19 symptoms prior to reporting to school/work and before getting on the bus.
- If a student/staff has symptoms of COVID-19, tested positive for COVID-19, or come into close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 they should stay home and report the absence to the school they attend.
- Students/staff that exhibit or report COVID-19 symptoms will be asked to isolate at home for 10 days following the onset of symptoms. Individuals may return prior to 10-day period if they can provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test or a physician's note with an alternate return date.

CONTACT TRACING/ QUARANTINE

- Individuals identified as a close contact will be asked to quarantine for 14 days from the last day of contact.
- A close contact is an individual who was within 3-6 feet of a person diagnosed with COVID-19 for a total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.
- Fully vaccinated, asymptomatic individuals will not have to quarantine if they are identified as a close contact if they can provide proof of vaccination status.
- Seating charts will be used in classrooms, cafeterias, and buses.

SANITIZING/CLEANING & HYGIENE

- Hand sanitizer will be available throughout each building and in each classroom.
- Cough/sneeze etiquette and hand hygiene will be encouraged of all students/staff.
- Routine cleaning is performed on a regular basis by custodial staff in each building.
- Supplemental sanitizing of high-touch surfaces will occur frequently throughout the school day by custodial staff.
- Emergency cleaning will be implemented at the direction of the Director of Maintenance, Superintendent, or designee in response to positive cases.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Social distancing will be deployed in classrooms, cafeterias and buses as much as possible. • Use of shared supplies and materials will be minimized. • Students will be kept in a cohort group PK-5th grade. • Physical Education is held outside when weather permits. • Visitors will be screened for COVID-19 symptoms and temperature checked prior to admittance. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parents may transport their student to school. • Seats will be assigned on the bus and siblings will sit together. • Students need to consistently ride the same bus for the morning and afternoon routes. • Staff/students are required to wear a facial covering while riding the bus per Federal guidelines. • No eating on the bus unless medically necessary. • Bus is cleaned and disinfected/sanitized between each route and as needed. • Hand sanitizer will be made available on the bus. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All eligible staff and students are encouraged to get the COVID-19 vaccine.
